## Statistics

- ▶ Cancer is one of the leading causes of death worldwide 8.2 million people die every year.
- ▶ According to World health organization cancer will increase 70% in the next 20 years.
- ▶ Are more than 200 types of cancer.
- ▶ 169.3 million years of active life are los globally due to cancer
- ▶ 32.6 million people live with cancer in the world.
- ▶ Patients diagnosed in the previous 5 years and still alive at the end of 2012- latest available statistics.

# Risk factors

- ▶ The risk associates with habits such as: smoking, diet and obesity, physical inactivity, consumption of alcohol .
- ▶ The access to medicines for pain for cancer patient have distribute fallow 99% of untreated and painful deaths occur in developing countries, 90% of the global consumption of opioid analgesics occurs in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, USA, and some European countries. Less than 10% of the total amount of these medicines is available for 80% of the world population.

## Why is it so important to get the funds and where do they come from?

- ▶ Thanks to you, St. Jude is at the forefront of research and treatment of childhood cancer and other terminal illnesses worldwide.
- ▶ Unlike other hospitals, most of St. Jude's money comes from generous donors. The daily operating cost of St. Jude is \$ 2 million. Approximately 75% of these costs are covered by individual donations, which are vital to finance the operation of the hospital
- ▶ Families never receive a St. Jude bill for treatment, transportation, lodging, or food - because families focus on helping their children live.
- ▶ Treatments invented at St. Jude have helped increase the survival rate of childhood cancer by 20% to 80% since the hospital opened its doors more than 50 years ago.
- ▶ Because most St. Jude funding comes from individual donations, St. Jude is free to focus on the most important - saving the lives of children regardless of their financial situation. The daily operating cost of St. Jude is \$ 2 million. Approximately 75% of these costs are covered by individual donations.

## Responsibility to patients

Children arriving in St. Jude are suffering from life-threatening pediatric illnesses such as cancer and sickle cell disease, and many of our treatment protocols require medical care for years to come. For example, the average cost to treat acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL), the most common form of childhood cancer, is more than \$ 485,000 with a treatment plan of two to three years. When St Jude begin to treat a child, IT has a responsibility to ensure that it will be able to complete that treatment and that medical care for that child for as long as we need it.

The mission of the St. Jude International Outreach Program is to improve the survival rates of children with cancer and other catastrophic diseases worldwide. This is achieved as follows:

- Sharing knowledge, technology and organizational skills.
- Implementing New Approaches to Treating Pediatric Cancer Globally.
- Generating international networks committed to eradicating cancer in children.

Collecting funds for St. John's children not only contributes to a great cause, but also helps to strengthen the unity of your team through a meaningful activity. This type of commitment serves to raise employee morale, promote leadership and contribute to the company's reputation.
