Newark Helpful Hearts organization opened their doors just months after the Great Recession, on October 2008. The founders are Angela Alvarez, Yudelka Hernandez, Nidia Moreano and Bonnie Rodriguez, four colleagues that noticed how the recession affected people financially. By that year, many people lost their jobs and homes, which increased the percentage of homeless people.

New Jersey, especially Essex county, held the highest volume of homeless people. After seeing everything that was happening around us, we decided to do something for our community and created an organization where we collaborated with volunteers who were willing to make a change in the lives of the homeless.







The Newark Helpful Hearts organization provides for homeless individuals and families by giving them a roof over their heads. They are also given a great supply of healthy fresh food. Since health is very important, we provide the individuals with medical care, such as counseling and annual physical exams. We also take education very seriously and teach them how to integrate back into society by training, educating, and providing job opportunities. Our doors will be open to all 24/7 all year round.







Our vision is to help more homeless individuals and families stay off the streets and to have a warm place to call home. We also plan on integrating them back into society, in a short amount time with their new learned skills. In the future we would like to build more centers in other New Jersey counties in order to expand our help to those in need.





KIDS AT HELPFUL HEARTS



NEWARK HELPFUL HEARTS has the commitment to help the children during their homeless situation, however they will need funds in order to implement some special programs to help them to overcome this stage.

Kids can receive special attention. The actual programs segregated the kids, however they do not have the adequate logistics in order for them to receive special attention. Pregnancy and childhood are both stages when a human being should be exposed to the least amount of stress possible. Therapies can be provided

SPECIAL ATTENTION FOR KIDS WITH DISABILITIES.



Some of this kids are homeless as a consequence of child abuse. Others were born with some physical disabilities that does not allow them to perform some regular activities. These are the reasons why special treatments and personnel need to be implemented in the center.



Also even though kids keep attending schools, they will need to count with special instructors to assist children on a daily basis. Most of these children are facing attention deficit disorder as a result of the stress provided by there circumstances, therapy and face to face activities should be implemented. Also a area for special therapy is needed in the center.





NEWARK HELPFUL HEARTS has assisted countless of women during their pregnancy. This is a stage of life when a woman needs to be exposed to less stress and need to get adequate nutrition. Special attention and programs should be provided to pregnant women.






NEWARK HELPFUL HEARTS tries it's best to accommodate pregnant women. However the visit of a Gynecologist at least monthly is required. Also a nutritionist is needed in order to create a program to help them get the nutrients necessary during the pregnancy.



ADDICTIONS

The center segregates people who are having addiction problems. In order to give them individualized attention. Hundreds of young individuals and adults facing additions has been rescued by this organization. Some of the addictions treated are the following :

- Alcohol dependency
- Cocaine
- Marijuana
- Prescriptions medication (painkillers)



NEWARK HELPFUL HEARTS does it's best to help homeless people to overcome addictions. With 1,000,000 they will be able to provide counseling and rehabilitation treatment, essential life skills instruction and sometimes even continuing education or career resources








CAREER OPPORTUNITY



Although the center has every attention in helping people to reintegrate into society, they do not count with the appropriate personnel to assist them efficiently. **A Career Development Department with prepared** personnel is needed to help them build appropriate resumes, and to have contact with specific agencies to assist with employment.



according to the 2017 NJ Counts Point-In-Time homeless study, is that statewide, the number of homeless New Jersey residents dropped 4.6 percent from last year.

STATISTICS HOMELESSNESS IN NEW JERSEY ESSEX COUNTY

The Essex area is the most homeless residents in the state for the third year in a row, according to a report from Monarch Housing Associates, which organized the annual one-day count for 2017 in January.



2,048 homeless people counted, Essex County's total dwarfs the tally from the second-highest county, Hudson, which had 822 homeless residents, according to the study.

STATISTICS HOMELESSNESS IN NEW JERSEY ESSEX COUNTY

About 59.6% (1,220 persons) of homeless persons were male, 39.8% (816) were female, and 8 (0.4%) were transgender.

64.1% of persons identified their race as African-American. The next largest subgroup as White 19.1% American Indian/Native American 1.3% and Hispanic. 17.7%

Families included 795 persons, 465 hildren under age 8, and 330 adults. About 32.7% (669 persons) of nomeless reported (having some type of disability. About 89 homeless households (5.9%) identified as victims of domestic violence.

> 273 families with at least one child under the age of 18 and one adult.

> > The age range most represented were adults between 45 and 54 (379 persons, 18.5%).
